PROJECTS, PROJECTS, PROJECTS

This fall one of the bigger projects that I have been working on has been repairs at the lodges, particularly Blue Spruce. It is hard to believe that Blue Spruce and White Pine are nearly 25 years old. I spent time repairing some rot on the exterior logs, especially on Blue Spruce. The facade of many logs had to be cut out and replaced. Additionally, our lodges have threaded rods spaced every 16" which go from the top of the wall to the bottom and they need to be tightened periodically. As these rods were tightened, new insulation was installed in the access bays to prevent energy loss. Now we are planning to add new seamless gutters to help preserve the building by eliminating splash-back and thus minimizing wood deterioration.

We also plan to spend time painting the Blue Spruce interior this winter and this spring we will put another coat of stain on the exterior.

As we are approaching our 25 year anniversary of building these lodges, the trustees have set up a fund for some upcoming maintenance needs for these buildings. Some of the larger items that are going to need updated soon are; roofing, HVAC units,
